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REPORT OF THE MEETING

The eighth meeting of Thailand's National Fisheries *Refugia* Committee for the project entitled "Establishment and Operation of a Regional System of Fisheries *Refugia* in the South China Sea and Gulf of Thailand" was conducted virtually via Zoom Application by the Department of Fisheries on 19th April 2021, 13.30 – 16.30 hours. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Vicharn Ingsrisawang, Deputy Director-General of the Department of Fisheries, acted for the Director-General in his absence. Apart from the committee members, participants also included SEAFDEC Secretary-General and the officers from SEAFDEC and the Department of Fisheries, 21 attendees in total. Meeting agenda and list of participants are shown in annex 1 and 2, respectively. The meeting minutes are as follows:

AGENDA 2 APPROVAL OF REPORT OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

2.1 **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn**, Senior Expert in Marine Fisheries, as the Committee and Secretary, informed the meeting that report of the previous meeting, i.e., the seventh meeting of Thailand's National Fisheries *Refugia* Committee on 30th November 2020, had been handed out to each committee member for consideration. In this regard, she requested the meeting to consider, amend, and approve the report, which was prepared as the attachment to the meeting document.

2.2 **Meeting Resolution:** The committee approved report of the seventh meeting of Thailand's National Fisheries *Refugia* Committee on 30th November 2020.

AGENDA 3 MATTERS OF REPORT

3.1 Progress of the Project Implementation

3.1.1 **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn** reported to the meeting the progress of project implementation, by activities and their results, from October 2020 to March 2021. Her presentation is shown in Annex 3, concluded as follows:

 Conducting the fourth meeting of Thailand's National Scientific and Technical Committee on 9th November 2020

Meeting resolution:




Figure 1 Tentative fisheries refugia boundary: Koh Sed, Ban Don Bay, Surat Thani Province

• Boundary of fisheries *refugia* in Surat Thani Site to be proposed for consideration by Site-based Fisheries *Refugia* Management Board in Surat Thani was the tentative area of 2x3 km² around Koh Sed, as shown in Figure 1.

• Measures according to the Section 56, 70, and 71 (1) in the Royal Ordinance on Fisheries B.E. 2558 (2015) were to be taken into consideration for management planning of fisheries *refugia* in Koh Sed. Details of such the Sections are as follows:

Section 56 – No person shall catch aquatic animals in an aquatic species sanctuary as prescribed by the Minister or by the provincial fisheries committee subject to the approval of the Minister, except for the purposes of academic advancement or for the purposes of the nurturing of aquatic animal breeds for which permission in writing has been granted by the Director-General or a person assigned by the Director-General. There shall be attached to a notification determining any aquatic species sanctuary pursuant to paragraph one a map delineating the areas prescribed thereby.

Section 70 – No person shall engage in a fishing operation during a season of aquatic animals' ovulation and egg-spawning, larvae rearing or during any other period of time designated for the protection of aquatic animals as prescribed by the Minister.

Section 71 – The Minister or the provincial fisheries committee shall have the power to issue notifications regarding the following: (1) fishing gears according to their forms, fishing methods, fishing areas, the size of fishing vessels used in fishing operation and other conditions that are prohibited from fishing operations in fishing grounds.


- The following data were to be prepared as the supportive information for the upcoming meeting of Site-based Fisheries Refugia Management Board in Surat Thani Province on 28th December 2020:
 - Fishing grounds in Surat Thani Province,
 - \circ $\,$ Mapping of the size distribution of blue swimming crab in Ban Don Bay,
 - \circ $\,$ Mapping of the size distribution of blue swimming crab around Koh Sed,
 - Mapping of shellfish farming in Ban Don Bay, and
 - Number and locations of crab Banks in Chaiya Dtstrict (the nearest district to Koh Sed).
- Conducting the seventh meeting of Thailand's National Fisheries Refugia Committee on 30th November 2020


Meeting resolution:

- Boundary of fisheries *refugia* in Surat Thani Site was to be taken into consideration in the meeting of Site-based Fisheries *Refugia* Management Board in Surat Thani Province; information on coastal seas boundary and the areas of shellfish farming in Ban Don Bay were to be provided by Surat Thani Provincial Fisheries Office.
- Management planning for fisheries *refugia* site in the area of Koh Sed was to be taken into consideration, on the basis of technical information, by Site-based Fisheries *Refugia* Management Board in Surat Thani Province, and approved by Surat Thani Provincial Fisheries Committee.
- Activities for management measures, integrated mapping, and cooperation for fisheries *refugia* management between Thailand and Cambodia were to be undertaken upon the following recommendations:
 - Management measures should be clear-cut, consistent with the area context, and not affect the fishers' live,
 - Integrated mapping of fisheries *refugia* sites in Trat Province of Thailand and Koh Kong Province of Cambodia should be prepared for the benefit of co-management between the two countries, and
 - Establishment of fisheries *refugia* in Trat Site of Thailand should be conducted in coordination with Koh Kong of Cambodia.
- Conducting the second meeting of Site-based Fisheries *Refugia* Management Board in Surat Thani Province on 28th December 2020 Meeting resolution:
 - Two options of fisheries *refugia* area were to be proposed for consideration in the local stakeholder consultations:
 - \circ $\;$ the rectangular area of 2x3 km^2 (3,750 Thai rai) around Koh Sed, and
 - \circ $\;$ the area of over 2x3 km^2 around Koh Sed, extended to some extent.
 - Measures according to Section 56 and 71 (1) in the Royal Ordinance on Fisheries B.E. 2558 (2015) were to be taken into consideration for management planning of fisheries *refugia* in Koh Sed.

- Local stakeholder consultations were to be conducted in all the coastal communities in Ban Don Bay of Surat Thani Province in order to provide community-based boundary delineation and management planning of fisheries *refugia* for blue swimming crab in Koh Sed.
- Conducting 7 local consultation workshops on fisheries *refugia* boundary and management planning in Surat Thai Site on 9th – 15th March 2021 Meeting resolution:
 - Fisheries *refugia* boundary:

An area of approximately $1.5x6 = 9 \text{ km}^2$ with rectangular boundary lying longitudinally northeast-southwest along the water channel, covering all sand dune area of Koh Sed (Figure 2)






- Management planning:
 - Management measure –

Section 71 (1) in the Royal Ordinance on Fisheries B.E. 2558 (2015) – The Minister or the provincial fisheries committee shall have the power to issue notifications regarding the following: (1) fishing gears according to their forms, fishing methods, fishing areas, the size of fishing vessels used in fishing operation and other conditions that are prohibited from fishing operations in fishing grounds.

- $\circ~$ Prohibited fishing gears
 - (1) Crab trap
 - (2) Crab gill net, below 3.0 inch in mesh-size
 - (3) All types of clam fishing operated in motor vessels.
- 5) Conducting cooperating survey with community to define geographic location of tentative fisheries refugia boundary around Koh Sed of Surat Thani Site on 30th March 2021. Survey results: geographic location of tentative fisheries refugia boundary around Koh Sed of Surat Thani Site was defined as shown in figure 3



6) Creating online national web portal for fisheries *refugia* in Thailand Results: online national web portal for fisheries *refugia* in Thailand was created with a URL of <u>https://inter.fisheries.go.th/fishrefugia</u>. Initial menu of the web portal are as follows:

3.1.2 **Dr. Vicharn Ingsrisawang**, Deputy Director-General of the Department of Fisheries, inquired about the process for co-management of short mackerel in fisheries *refugia* sites between Trat of Thailand and Koh Kong of Cambodia.

3.1.3 **Dr. Worawit Wanchana,** Policy and Program Coordinator for SEAFDEC/SEC, noted that for coordinating mechanism, the issue of co-management for short mackerel in fisheries *refugia* sites between Thailand and Cambodia should be raised for consideration in the meeting of SEAFDEC Council.

3.1.4 **Ms. Malinee Smithrithee**, Secretary General and Chief of the Training Department, SEAFDEC, noted that co-management mechanism has not been involved in the activities of fisheries *refugia* project. As a result, such the issue should be putted into the coordinating mechanism via SEAFDEC Council or under the MOU of bilateral cooperation between Thailand and Cambodia.

3.1.5 The meeting agreed that the information for bilateral co-management of short mackerel between Thailand and Cambodia was to be provided for putting into consideration in the next SEAFDEC Council meeting.

3.1.6 Regarding fisheries *refugia* boundary at Koh Sed of Surat Thani Site, the meeting agreed to have the accurate geographic location made by Information and Communication Technology Center of the Department of Fisheries, preparing for consideration in the meeting of Surat Thani Provincial Fisheries Committee.

3.1.7 In the matter of information dissemination of fisheries *refugia* in Thailand, **Dr. Vicharn Ingsrisawang** recommended cooperating with the Public Relation Group of the Department of Fisheries.

3.1.8 **Meeting Resolution:** the meeting acknowledged the progress of project implementation and greed to carry out the activities upon recommendation.

3.2 Report of the Project Extension

3.2.1 **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn** reported to the meeting the project extension process which would be extended to the end of 2022, having timeline as follows:

- 5th October 2020: Project Steering Committee, UNEP, and SEAFDEC approved the 2 years extension of fisheries *refugia* project from January 2020 to December 2022 with no additional budget. Budget revision was also made in accordance with the implementation period and output.
- 29th October 2020: Project Coordinating Unit submitted the document for project extension to UNEP Task Manager for consideration.
- 30th December 2020: UNEP and SEAFDEC approved and signed the contract for 2.5 years project extension. The period of extension was aimed to cover the process of project achievement evaluation. The budget revision was under the process of consideration and approval by UNEP.
- Project Director was under recruited.

3.2.2 **Mr. Isara Chanrachkij**, Project Planning and Management Division Head for SEAFDEC/TD, informed the meeting that recruitment of Project Director would be completed by the end of May 2021.

3.2.3 Meeting Resolution: the meeting acknowledged.

AGENDA 4 MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

4.1 Revision of the Notifications on Fisheries *Refugia* Management Committee in Thailand

4.1.1 **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn** informed the meeting that there had been institutional revisions in the Department of Fisheries and the relevant organizations. In this matter, she requested the meeting to revise the member lists of 4 notifications as follows:

- Thailand's National Fisheries Refugia Committee,
- Thailand's National Scientific and Technical Committee,
- Site-based Fisheries Refugia Management Board in Trat Province, and
- Site-based Fisheries Refugia Management Board in Surat Thani Province.

4.1.2 Regarding Thailand's National Fisheries Refugia Committee, **Mr. Weerasak Yingyuad**, Representative from Project Coordinating Unit, recommended altering the representative from SEAFDEC from committee to be the project advisor.

4.1.3 **Mr. Isara Chanrachkij** recommended adding representatives from SEAFDEC to be the committees for Thailand's National Fisheries Refugia Committee and Thailand's National Scientific and Technical Committee.

4.1.4 **Meeting Resolution:** the meeting agreed to revise the member lists of the committees and boards according to recommendations from the meeting, and further coordinate with SEAFDEC, Trat Provincial Fisheries Office, and Surat Thani Provincial Fisheries Office for the member list revision.

4.2 Proceedings after the Local Consultation Workshops on Fisheries *Refugia* Boundary and Management Planning in Surat Thani Site

4.2.1 **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn** concluded the resolutions from the total of 7 local consultation workshops on fisheries *refugia* boundary and management planning in Surat Thani Site as follows:

- Fisheries *refugia* boundary was to be an area of approximately 1.5x6 = 9 km² (5,625 Thai rai) with rectangular boundary lying longitudinally northeast-southwest along the water channel, covering all the sand dune area of Koh Sed, and
- Section 71 (1) in the Royal Ordinance on Fisheries B.E. 2558 (2015) The Minister or the provincial fisheries committee shall have the power to issue notifications regarding the following: (1) fishing gears according to their forms, fishing methods, fishing areas, the size of fishing vessels used in fishing operation and other conditions that are prohibited from fishing operations in fishing grounds was to be used as the management measure in the fisheries *refugia* site, with the following prohibited fishing gear: (1) Crab trap, (2) Crab gill net, below 3.0 inch in mesh-size, and (3) All types of clam fishing operated in motor vessels.

4.2.2 In the matter of resolutions from stakeholder consultations, **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn** requested the meeting to make a recommendation on the implementation for moving forward.

4.2.3 Meeting Resolution:

- Geographic location of fisheries *refugia* site at Koh Sed was to be prepared by Chumphon Fisheries Research and Development Center prior to submitting to Thailand's National Scientific and Technical Committee for approval, and
- Notification for prescribing fisheries *refugia* site and its management measure was to be drafted by Surat Thani Provincial Fisheries Office prior to certifying by the Law Division of the Department of Fisheries. The certified notification was subsequently to be proposed for approval at Surat Thani Provincial Fisheries Committee meeting.

4.3 Budget Balance as of Quarter 1/2021 and Costed Workplan for Quarter 2/2021

4.3.1 **Ms. Praulai Nootmorn** reported on the budget balance of fisheries *refugia* project for Thailand as of quarter 1/2021 (31th March 2021), concluded as follows:

4.3.3 **Meeting Resolution:** the meeting acknowledged the budget balance as of quarter 1/2021 and approved the costed workplan for quarter 2/2021. The meeting additionally requested project working team to provide the costed workplan for overall implementation up to the end of the project.

4.4 Management Planning for Fisheries *Refugia* of Short Mackerel in Trat Site

4.4.1 According to the resolution from stakeholder consultations in Trat Site, samplings for catch composition of short mackerel gill netters were to be undertaken to provide supportive technical information for management planning consideration. In this regard, Mr. Udom Khrueniam, Senior Fisheries Technical Officer from Rayong Fisheries Research and Development Center, informed the meeting that only a small number of samples was obtained due to the severe situation of COVID 19 pandemic in the east of Thailand, making insufficient data of catch composition needed for consideration on short mackerel management in Trat Site

4.4.2 **Dr. Vicharn Ingsrisawang** recommended continuing sampling to obtain all-year catch data.

4.4.3 **Ms. Sansanee Wangworalak**, Lecturer from the Faculty of Fisheries, Kasetsart University, recommended concerning the previous catch data of short mackerel gill netters in Trat Site for consideration on management planning in fisheries *refugia* site.

4.4.4 **Meeting Resolution:** previous catch compositions of short mackerel gill netters in Trat Site were to be prepared by Rayong Marine Fisheries Research and Development Center and presented to the National's Scientific and Technical committee for consideration on the appropriate management planning of short mackerel in Trat fisheries *refugia* site.
