1. Field Trip Objective

 To review the map boundary of the plan for marine fisheries management area in Kampot province and take the management measure of the small fish of grouper collection under the support of SEAFDEC/UNEP/GEF.

2. Involved Person

- 2) There are five leader and officers from Department of Fisheries Conservation and one officer from Fisheries Administration Cantonment in Kampot, participating in reviewing the map boundary of the plan for marine fisheries management area in Kampot province and taking the management measure of the small fish of grouper collection (see Annex 1, 2 & 3), naming as following:
 - Mr. Leng Sy Vann, Deputy Director of Department of Fisheries Conservation and NSTFP
 - Mr. Seng Leang, Chief of Extension and Administration Division of Department of Fisheries Conservation
 - Ms. Ly Sokta, Officer of Department of Fisheries Conservation
 - Ms. Kin Samnang, Officer of Department of Fisheries Conservation

3. Field Trip Activities

A. Discussion with Community Fisheries on the management measurement the small fish collection of grouper

- 3) Teamwork led by Mr. Leng Sy Vann met and discussed with community fisheries on the management measure of small fish of grouper collection. According to discussion with CFi, the small fish harvesting started in October to February at Tropaing Ropaov and Prek Thnaot CFi sites because those sites are rich of the small fish of grouper. Why those CFi are rich of the small fish of grouper? Because those areas are a lot of sea grass bed that are their habitat and feed.
- 4) The quantity and size of small fish collection varied based on season and month. Generally, fishers can catch a lot of fish from September to November, but the fish size is too small. Those small fish are harvested by mouse tailed trap from 70-80head/day/household, and push net from 20 to 30head/day/household. Almost fish collected are in the purpose of cage aquaculture by themselves at Tropaing Ropaov and Prek Thnaot sites and the rest of them are sold to traders at village for their cage culture.
- 5) Therefore, CFi suggested stopping harvesting small fish in December to February because those months are lot of seed in order to increase fish stock in the nature

B. Discussion with Fishermen

6) Teamwork met and discussed with fisher and traders focusing on the period of small fish collection and type of fishing gear. In general, the small fish of grouper are harvested starting from October to November. The fish is mostly collected at Trapaing Ropaov and Prek Thnaot CFi because those sites are rich of sea grass for their habitat and feeding. The fishing gears are used such as push net and mouse tailed trap. Now there are a lot of mouse tailed trap, can catch from 30 to 50head/day, however that number reduced if it is compared in the period of 10 year ago. In 2009, fishers can harvest small fish from 100 to 200head/day and sometimes they can harvest up to 500head/day.

C. Discussion with Traders

7) Teamwork met and discussed with traders buying small fish for cage culture. According to discussion with traders, the traders buying small fish is in the price of Riel 1000 to Riel

- 1500/head based on season. The high price of seed is from the month of December to February because of its big size.
- 8) They added that there are 6 traders and 100 cages at Tropaing Ropaov, but two traders and 10 cages at Prek Thnaot. They stocked 500head/cage with culture period of 11 months in the weight of 1.1kg/head and sold out fish in the price of USD 11/kg.

D. Review and verify the map boundary of marine fisheries management area

9) Teamwork went down to verify the map boundary of MFMA, especially at the sites of three CFi such as Trapaing Ropaov, Prek Thnaot, and Chhorng Horn CFis.

4. Conclusion

- 10) Based on the discussion with CFi, Fishermen, Traders, it is concluded as follow:
 - Small fish of grouper are harvested staring from September to February and rich in October to November
 - Fish seed are collected for cage culture at Trapaing Ropaov and Prek Thnaot CFis
 - There are 6 traders at Trapaing Ropaov and two traders at Prek Thnaot sites.
