HIGHLIGHT ACTIVITIES

- On the First day, a courtesy call to Ms. Olive Gregorio, Municipal Environment & Natural Resources Officer was made. A short meeting was conducted together with the Refugia Management Team. We informed her purpose of the trip.
- 2) We meet the two Enumerators assigned in Masinloc to monitor their sampling activities. We visited Matalvis landing area but unfortunately there was no landing of fish for during the visit. After the visit we proceed to Balogo fish landing site and one of the fishermen informed the team that they unloaded their catch last night.
- 3) We also visit the actual fish landing sites in Poblacion and Baloganon on the day two, five fishing boats landed in poblacion landing site, majority of fish catch in Poblacion were anchovies and sardines, a total of 51 kilos landed that day.
- 4) After the observation in Poblacion Fish Landing Site, we visited the Baloganon landing site, only 4 fishing vessels landed their catch during the visit. Catch composition landed in the area are mainly small pelagic.
- 5) After the visit we provided the enumerators additional sampling materials and data forms.
