REPORT OF THE MEETING

The Meeting was organized by Research Institute of Fish Resources Enhancement (RIFE) on June 22th 2022 in Bekasi, West Java. The meeting was held attended from RIFE, Center for Fisheries Research (CRF), Agency of Marine and Fisheries Research, and Human Resources (AMFRHR), and Directorate General of Marine Spatial Management (DGMSM).

MEETING NOTES:

- The academic draft that has been prepared will soon be submitted to the local government in this case the Marine and Fisheries Service of West Kalimantan Province and Bangka Belitung Province as a reference basis for fisheries management under 12 nautical miles.
- Recommendations for fishery areas can be submitted as material for the revision of the Zoning Plan for Coastal Areas and Small Islands (RZWP3K in Indonesia)
- This fishery refugia is very appropriate to be implemented in order to support the blue economy principle as the basis for the implementation of measurable fisheries by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries.
- Guidelines for fisheries refugia based on activities in two provinces are used as a reference for the preparation of fisheries refugia in other Indonesian
- Discussing the agreement on the management of Fisheries Refugia in Indonesia
- Utilization of marine space must be considered in the establishment and management of fisheries refugia because it will be related to authority. The management of fishery activities carried out in zones below 12 miles from the coastline is under the authority of the province, while for territorial waters above 12 miles it is the authority of the central government.
