SUMMARY REPORT ON TRAINING AND LIVELIHOOD NEEDS ASSESSMENT AND VALIDATION 1

Introduction

- 1. The project pilot site in the Philippines is located in Samar Sea and the national project activities have been undertaken in accordance with the process for the development and implementation of the Samar Sea Fisheries Management Plan (SSFMP). The Technical Working Group (TWG) members representing the various stakeholders in the pilot site have been instrumental in the formulation and implementation of the project activities. Consultations/meetings on project issues, objectives and activities have been conducted as well as data and information generation to lay the foundation and steps for the establishment of the fisheries management plan. The activities of the project include data and information collection on boat and gear inventory, fishing gear cataloguing, fishing ground and critical habitat mapping, icthyoplankton and trawl bycatch surveys and socioeconomic surveys of trawls and other fishing gears.
- 2. Project activities under the 3rd LOA with FAO include a Training Needs Assessment and Livelihood Validation Workshop (which were conducted on 16 September 2015 and 26 February 2016) in order to identify/validate the requirements of the fishers in the 11 coastal municipalities bordering the Samar Sea Pilot Area.

Training Needs Assessment and Livelihood Validation Workshops, 16 September 2015

- 3. Mr. Norberto T. Berida, Co-Chair of Project Technical Working Group (TWG) and Regional Training Center Director of BFAR-RFTC8, warmly welcomed the participants (Annex 1) of the workshop in order to discuss the assessment and develop technical papers for submission to the RFU. He acknowledged everyone who was at the meeting for the good representation of the various local government units and stakeholders and encouraged them to actively participate with their ideas. The Agenda for September 16, 2016 is reflected in the TWG meeting prospectus (Annex 2).
- 4. **Mr. Rafael V. Ramiscal**, National Program Coordinator and Chief, Capture Fishing Technology Division, BFAR, explained the need to have this workshop in order to accomplish the activity and prepare necessary reports under the Letter of Agreement 3 (LOA3) specifically on the livelihoods and training needs assessment.
- 5. He informed that the LOA3 activities focused on support to alternative livelihoods as an option for affected fishers to mitigate SSFMP impact, as well as capacity building on EAFM and seminar/dissemination of the SSFMP at community level, NAG Meeting and a final stakeholder consultation.

- 6. *Mr. Norberto T. Berida*, Training Director, BFAR-RFO 8, presented the rationale for the assessment of alternative livelihoods appropriate for small trawl users, illegal fishers (dynamite fishers), and other fishing gear users.
- 7. He presented the **Training Needs Assessment Survey Form** and finalized details for the Training Needs Assessment for Livelihoods guide.
- 8. The participants then identified specific livelihoods programs (summarized in Annex 3). The individual municipal outputs were then presented to the workshop for review and for improving the proposal. The proposals of the municipal agricultural officers (MAOs) and agricultural technicians (ATs) were subject for validation with local fishers in every municipality to ensure that the livelihood identified is really what the fishers require.
- 9. The National Project Coordinator (NPC) briefed the Meeting on the assignment of enumerators for the training needs survey and schedules (duration) by municipality. This will be done through a clustering system instead of by municipality, to facilitate and fast track the implementation of the livelihoods training program.

Validation of the list of beneficiaries and alternative fishing gears

- 10. The validation activities covered six (6) municipalities where trawlers operate. The focal TWG-members visited communities to validate the list of participants and alternative fishing gears based on the results of the needs assessment conducted. A list of the validated participants and their fishing gears was presented at the meeting (see attached list).
- 11. In summary, prospective participants listed 9 preferred alternative gears namely: bottom set gillnet, mackerel gillnet, crab gillnet, crab trap, handline, bottom set longline, gillnet for whiting, crab liftnet and mussel farming.
- 12. The project technical staff was requested to prepare Bill of Materials and the required purchase documents/process.
- 13. In summary, the prospective beneficiaries listed preferred and validated alternative gears (Annexes 4–6). Upon review by the TWG members (Annex 7) the project technical staff were given the go ahead to prepare the bill of materials.
